Environmental Management Policy

Our goal is 100% compliance with all applicable federal, state and local environmental regulations while sustaining our military mission. We will continue to develop our legacy of first-class environmental practices to reduce environmental impacts, sustain environmental compliance and promote the efficient use of our resources in all base activities. Travis will operationalize environmental quality throughout our mission by:

- Integrating and maintaining an effective EMS
- Protecting human health and the environment
- Incorporating environmental commitments into applicable policies and programs
- Encouraging an environmental culture across all levels of management
- Enhancing relations with regulatory agencies
- Partnering with all stakeholders to promote resource conservation
- Achieving continuous improvement in environmental performance

It is incumbent upon all installation personnel to fulfill the obligations set forth in this policy statement to the utmost of their abilities in accordance with their roles and responsibilities on the installation. This Travis Environmental, Safety and Occupational Health Council (ESOHC) will annually review and update this policy and related environmental aspects, objectives, and targets.
