We plan on starting sessions sometime after the 2025 Military Retiree Appreciation Day event in October.

Some of the topics we want to cover include setting up myPay accounts, establishing, maintaining, and securing myPay, MHS Genesis, MilConnect, and other government accounts.

We will put a heavy emphasis on fraud prevention and online security. The purpose of the training sessions is to get our retiree customers use to handling their affairs online since the government and DOD are making more services, self-service.

We are setting up a self-service micro-pc kiosk in our office we will use to offer one-on-one training in account setup.

- Don't respond to emails about traffic fines, bridge tolls, FASTRAK tolls - all scams. These come in by snail mail.

## 2025 FEDVIP OPEN SEASON

Are you unhappy with your current dental and vision insurance plan?


Now is the time to start looking. FEDVIP Open Season for calendar year 2026 begins on 10 November 2025 and ends on 8 December 2025 at midnight.

You can view carriers, plans, pricing, and services at [Benefeds.com](https://www.benefeds.com).

FEDVIP is managed by OPM. Open enrollment is only available once a year unless a family experiences a life qualifying event (adoption, marriage, death, divorce, etc.). See the [Benefeds.com](https://www.benefeds.com) website for more information.

There are about a dozen carriers that provide dental and vision insurance, so families have a range of plans to choose from.

To summarize, midnight 8 December is the deadline, so now is the time to pick an insurance carrier especially if you need dental insurance for your family.

## myPay and Preparing for the 2025 Tax Season

The end of calendar year 2025 is rapidly approaching. Now is the time to start planning for the dreaded tax filing season.



If you have a myPay account through the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS), you need to review your retiree account information.

It's especially important if you have moved, changed bank accounts, changed your telephone number, had a beneficiary die, got re-married, divorced, or adopted/had a child.

Keeping this information up to date insures DFAS can contact you if there are any major changes to your retiree pay account.

Military retirees and self-sponsored spouses receiving SBP annuity payments are encouraged to set up a myPay account.

myPay account access gives military retirees and SBP annuitants instant access to their retirement pay and SBP annuity account statements.

The ability to change tax withholding, update and change bank account deposit information, download IRS form 1099-Rs for annual tax filing, and change beneficiaries for Arrears of Pay (military retiree) are the prime benefit to having a myPay account.

Many of these changes can be requested by mail; however, DFAS indicates it may take 45-60 days to process. Even if you send the request by certified mail, the letter is usually signed for in the mail room and things are known to get lost in distribution.

Using myPay will save you time and money on postal fees and give you instant access to your account information.

If you don't own a computer, iPad, or Android tablet. You can still mail your request to DFAS.

We can generate a template for you to use and give you the mailing address, or we can fax a request to the Retired Pay Section/SBP Annuitant Fax number for you. Just be aware, we will need your actual Date of Retirement for the fax we send. Please do this at least 90 days out.

It takes DFAS some time to process mailed in requests. Faxed requests may take 7 to 10 business days to process and DFAS needs to receive those from a government agency fax machine and number.

There have been times in the past the DFAS Fax machine has been down, so when it happens it may entail another trip for you to our office.

## Next Gen ID Card Renewals – Spouses turning 65

When a military retiree's spouse reaches the age of 65, he/she needs to renew their Next Gen ID Card.

At this age he/she is eligible for a Next Gen ID Card with an indefinite expiration date. The spouse is also eligible for TRICARE for Life provided he/she has enrolled in Medicare Part B three months prior to their 65<sup>th</sup> birthday.

If the spouse is enrolled in Medicare Part B, and he/she comes in and renews his/her ID card before attaining the age of 65, the new card will be issued with an expiration date.

We had a very irate retiree come into our office recently that said he was told his wife would be issued a card with an indefinite expiration date. She was enrolled in Medicare A and B, but she won't turn 65 until next month. Her old card was expiring at the end of the current month.

The volunteer explained to him that the MPF clerk that issued the card had applied the correct rules according to DOD Instructions the new ID card came with the expiration Date four years later and was correct.

The retiree left in a huff, said something about the volunteer being a #@!!% lifer and hurried out the door.

That lifer would be me – the author of this little missive. I've got thick skin and I've been called far worse things in my 74 plus years of life.

My team and I are here to assist you when we legally can. We are not paid --- we donate our time and talents to serve our retiree brothers and sisters.

We understand that some people will come to see us with problems that will leave them frustrated and angry. Take a deep breath, slow down, and we will see what we can do for you.

The downside to this situation is he will have to come back when she turns 65 to update her DEERS status and get military health care changed over to TRICARE for LIFE.

The upside to the situation is she has a current ID card she can use to enter the base, shop at the BX and Commissary, access medical services at DGMC, use MWR facilities, and clear TSA lines at the airport since the card she was issued meets Real ID requirements.

The next time you visit our office, we hope your experience will be more pleasant. Please be nice to the volunteers on the desk. You will probably get better service.
