Site Name: Fire Training Area #3

Site Description: FT004 is in the northeastern part of Travis AFB and consists of the former Fire Training Area #3, an unoccupied 30-acre open field that was used to train fire fighters from about 1953 to 1962. Waste fuels, oils, and solvents were burned on open ground, contaminating the groundwater with chlorinated solvents, mainly trichloroethene (TCE).

The list of chlorinated COCs for FT004 groundwater include TCE, cis-1,2-dichloroethene (DCE), 1,2-dichloroethane (DCA), chloroform, bromodichloromethane, 1,1-DCE, vinyl chloride, and 1,4-dichlorobenzene (DCB).

Selected Remedy: The Travis AFB Groundwater ROD (CH2M HILL, 2014) selected Alternative 2 (Monitored Natural Attenuation [MNA]) to address the residual dissolved solvent contamination.
