Site Name: Monitoring Well 246

Site Description: This site covers 22 acres and is in the central flightline area of Travis AFB. It consists of two contaminated groundwater areas. Plume A is in the vicinity of MW107x32, and Plume B is in the vicinity of MW246x32. Both plumes lie in open grassy fields and are surrounded by a runway, taxiways, and the aircraft parking apron. Aircraft operations are the only known uses for ST032. Travis AFB moved this site into the Petroleum-Only Contamination Program in 2009.

Selected Remedy: The Sites ST032 Remedial Action Report (CH2M HILL, 2011) established Monitored Natural Attenuation as the selected remedy. The final Site ST032 POCO Completion Report (CH2M HILL, 2017) documented the determination that Site ST032 meets all criteria for case closure in accordance with the State Water Resources Control Board's Low-Threat Underground Storage Tank Case Closure Policy, issued in August 2012.
