SUBJECT: Environmental Commitment Statement

1. SCOPE: The scope of this policy includes all activities, products and services associated with Travis Air Force Base (AFB), including partner wings, squadrons, support agencies, and contractors.
2. COMMITMENT STATEMENT: Travis AFB is committed to the Air Force mission of global mobility in an environmentally responsible manner to protect human health, natural resources and environment. Travis AFB will comply with applicable federal, state and local laws while maintaining an Environmental Management System (EMS) in accordance with AFI 32-7001 *Environmental Management*. Key environmental concerns affecting missions on Travis AFB include: increasing risk of wildfire in the local and regional areas protecting endangered species and protected wetland/vernal pool habitats. We continue to execute sound environmental practices to support national security missions, while reducing environmental impacts, sustaining environmental compliance and promoting efficient use of resources.
3. Travis AFB is committed to:
  - a. Striving for continual improvement in environmental performance and partnering with regulatory agencies, local communities, and tribal nations while ensuring exceptional stewardship of natural and cultural resources.
  - b. Reducing and mitigating the risk of wildfires through effective use of fire prevention measures, including but not limited to: disking, prescribed burns, grazing and other mitigation strategies.
  - c. Managing Hazardous Materials effectively through a strategic vision and reducing hazardous exposure to Airmen while efficiently managing and implementing pollution prevention initiatives to reduce waste generation.
  - d. Ensuring responsible energy use throughout Travis AFB with energy conservation practices and procedures, as well as energy efficiency improvements to encourage sustainability.
  - e. Set strong but realistic goals, measure progress and effectively communicate results through the EMS Cross Function Team, Unit Environmental Coordinators and Environmental, Safety, and Occupational Health Council.
