# 571st MSAS provides training to Colombia

Airmen from the 571st Mobility Support Advisory Squadron worked with the Colombian armed forces as part of a mobile training team from Feb. 11 through March 11 at two air bases in Colombia.

The team consisted of 15 air advisors from the 571st MSAS at Travis Air Force Base and six Total Force instructors from three other U.S. Air Force units. The training covered a variety of areas of cooperation between the U.S. and Colombia. It aimed at supporting Colombia in their pursuit to counter transnational and trans-regional threat networks and to enhance the capability of the Fuerza Aérea Colombiana, their air force or, FAC, to maintain regional security through increased proficiency in mobility support operations.

The training was conducted at Comando Aereo de Transporte Militar in Bogota, Colombia, and Comando Aereo Combate-1 in Palanquero, Colombia. The training topics focused on C-130 Hercules aircraft maintenance, aerial firefighting procedures, search and rescue, intelligence and medical intelligence.

The C-130s, located at Comando Aereo de Transporte Militar, are the workhorse of the FAC fleet, capable of conducting a diverse mission set. Throughout the engagement, 571st MSAS maintenance air advisors worked with the FAC to develop their maintenance philosophy, systems knowledge, and best practices and procedures. A heavy focus was placed on the C-130 engine, hydraulic, fuel, environmental and electrical system familiarization and troubleshooting.

Instructors conducted training through classroom briefings and hands-on training on the aircraft, to gain a thorough understanding of Colombian air force maintenance practices.

The students were very engaged in the training we provided," said Tech. Sgt. Jacob

Haines, 571st MSAS advisor. "I am confident that our students' capacity to properly maintain their C-130 fleet has increased."

Each of the courses taught throughout the three weeks culminated in a graduation ceremony. Colombian air force Technical 3rd Class Angel Arturo Hernandez Ramon, a maintenance technician, was appreciative of the training he and his fellow students received.

"I want to thank the United States of America, especially its Air Force, for sharing their knowledge in order to extend the ties of brotherhood and teamwork between the two nations," Hernandez Ramon said.

"Today, we culminate with great satisfaction, the electrical and wiring maintenance course, with new lessons and experiences that will facilitate us to execute the best quality standards, applying this knowledge to the aircraft that protect and safeguard the Colombian territory."

Additionally, the 571st MSAS team provided ground training to the Colombian air force on Modular Airborne Fire Fighting Systems, or MAFFS, a system loaded into the rear of a C-130 that drops fire retardant to aid in stopping the spread of wildfires.

Employing an aerial firefighting capability will help the FAC in combating wildfires,

both internally and internationally. The specialized training, provided by the U.S. Air Force Reserve Command personnel, was a stepping stone to future work with the FAC on further enhancing this capability.

"While a very effective firefighting tool, this specific mission set requires consistent practice," said Lt. Col. Richard

Pantusa, 731st Airlift Squadron MAFFS instructor pilot from Peterson Air Force Base, Colorado. "It is inherently a dangerous mission - flying low over mountainous terrain that is on fire. The FAC has a new MAFFS program that includes highly motivated and knowledgeable C-130 operators who are attempting to grow their

MAFFS program."

While training on the diverse capabilities of the C-130 was the main focus of the mission, the 571st MSAS air advisors also took the opportunity to support additional U.S. Southern Command lines of effort by continuing to develop interoperability between the U.S. and Colombia.

"This was a robust and complex MTT (Mobile Training Team), exemplifying the training the MSAS is capable of conducting in the Latin American region," said Capt. Shawn Penne, 571st MSAS mission commander. "I feel honored to have worked side by side with the

# Cruise ship travelers released

As of April 1, all 850 Grand Princess passengers have completed their quarantine and departed Travis Air Force Base.

The passengers arrived March 9 at Travis, where they received daily screening for Covid-19 symptoms, basic medical care for other health conditions, meals, quarantine-appropriate activities, and transportation to their final destinations, all by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Each person was also offered Covid-19 testing. Those passengers who tested positive were transferred to non-military facilities overseen by federal medical staff, and those passengers who developed acute symptoms were transferred to area hospitals.

"We can't overstate how much the cooperation and engagement of our federal, state, and local partners helped us meet this enormous challenge. Supporting the quarantine for these passengers assisted in slowing the spread of Covid-19 and with protecting the American public," said Dr. Robert Kadlec, HHS assistant secretary for Preparedness and Response. "A tremendous thank you goes to DoD and their outstanding staff at each installation. We are also grateful for the support received from local hospitals where seriously ill passengers were treated, as well as the health care providers who took care of them."

Agencies from across the U.S. government provided staff and resources to ensure the health, safety, and comfort of the Grand Princess cruise ship passengers. In addition to HHS

## Travis works to ensure readiness

As Covid-19 sweeps across the United States and the world, Travis AFB has taken several actions to prevent further spread of the virus while ensuring readiness.

The 60th Medical Group staff began planning to respond to Covid-19 and its potential impact on readiness weeks ago when the secretary of defense selected Travis AFB as a location to house quarantined people returning to America from Wuhan, China, to avoid Covid-19 exposure.

"We started deliberate planning in early February when we learned Travis AFB would receive repatriated American citizens," said Col. Kristen Beals, 60th MDG commander. "We knew that

was a Department of Health and Human Services mission, but we developed teams to assess what a Covid-19 response would look like at David Grant USAF Medical Center and the impact it could have at our installation.

"We developed several teams who would screen patients and visitors to DGMC, as well as ensure we could provide force health protection and mission assurance. To ensure those two things, we implemented a number of things to protect the force and screen patients."

Assessment teams assigned groups of health professionals to screen patients entering the Air Force's largest medical center, and they implemented personal protective equipment and physical distancing procedures to protect health care providers and customers, Beals said.

Additionally, Team Travis leaders took measures to mitigate the virus' impact and to maintain the health and safety of service members and their families.

Col. Jeffrey Nelson, 60th Air Mobility Wing commander, placed the base in Health Protection Condition Charlie March 18, restricted gatherings on base to fewer than 10 people and limited active-duty Airmen to traveling no more than 150 miles due to the growing spread of Covid-19 in the communities surrounding the base.

The pandemic has also impacted how the medical staff at DGMC provides care, said Beals.

"Routine, outpatient and elective surgeries have been curtailed, and we are leveraging telehealth options to the maximum extent possible," she said. "This enables

our provider teams in the clinics, who are not currently seeing patients face-to-face due to physical distancing, to handle visits over the phone. That's something we want to continue as Solano County, California, and the president may extend physical distancing measures."

President Donald Trump extended physical distancing guidelines through April 30 during a press conference March 29. The president also said he would assess the situation at the end of April, but that physical distancing measures could be implemented until June.

While the response to the Covid-19 pandemic has brought numerous changes, Beals said, her team is focused on providing essential services and maintaining

# Space Force takes shape

ARLINGTON, Va. — In a significant step that enhances the U.S. Space Force's capabilities and development, the Department of the Air Force has identified 23 U.S. Air Force organizations whose space-related missions will soon transfer to the Space Force.

Secretary of the Air Force Barbara Barrett, in conjunction with Chief of Space Operations Gen. John "Jay" Raymond and Chief of Staff of the Air Force Gen. David Goldfein, directed the transfer which entails shifting space missions from Air Force organizations into the newest military branch.

Currently, Space Force is comprised primarily of units which previously fell under the former Air Force Space Command prior to the service's establishment on Dec. 20, 2019.

According to Space Force officials, the goal is to have each of the 23 space missions formally transferred from the Air Force into the Space Force within the next three to six months based on timing and conditions specific to each organization and mission. The CSAF and CSO have been delegated the authority to actually execute the transfer when they jointly agree the necessary conditions have been met to affect a smooth transfer.

The following locations have been identified for a transfer action. An asterisk indicates a partial mission transfer, such as the size of a flight, branch or division:

- 17th Test Squadron, Peterson Air Force Base, Colorado.
- 18th Intel Squadron, Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio.

# BMT takes steps to protect trainees

JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-LACKLAND, Texas – To help slow the spread of Covid-19 while accomplishing the mission of turning civilians into mission-ready Airmen, Air Force basic military training has implemented layers of protective measures to mitigate the risk of spreading the virus within the BMT pipeline.

Specific mitigation measures that have been implemented across BMT include implementation of a 14-day restriction of movement upon arrival, as well as social distancing, symptom monitoring and increased sanitation.

"We must balance the need to fuel the greatest Air and Space Force in the world with ready and able Airmen while caring for our trainees, military training instructors and their families," said Chief Master Sgt. Stefan Blazier, 37th Training Wing command chief. "This is a dynamic and constantly evolving situation, but what we won't do is watch from the sidelines. Our BMT team and leaders across the Gateway Wing will continue to implement protective measures to ensure the safety of our number one priority – America's sons and daughters – our Airmen – our team."

The first positive case of Covid-19 was reported at BMT March 25. With proactive planning and protective measures already in place, the necessary

firewalls were in place to safely address the situation and isolate the affected Airman from their flight, enabling specific training objectives to continue and protecting the BMT pipeline and team.

"The first phase of mitigation was placing newly arriving recruits in ROM status, which began the week of March 16," said Lt. Col. Gary Moore, 737th Training Group deputy commander. "All inbound BMT recruits are now placed in ROM for 14 days to better protect the

health and safety of the trainees and military training instructors. The ROM squadrons are strategically located in facilities that have the majority of the supporting elements such as laundry, dining facility and classrooms on location to ensure the trainees are separated from the

larger BMT population."

Social distancing, which has been identified by the CDC as a major factor in slowing the spread of the virus, has also been implemented across BMT. The distance between trainee beds has been increased and the

# C-130J does first assault landing on Yokota taxiway

YOKOTA AIR BASE, Japan — For the first time, Yokota Air Base personnel conducted a C-130J Super Hercules assault landing on the Foxtrot taxiway March 26.

Foxtrot taxiway was originally used for the legacy C-130H models from 1991 to 2001. Since then, Yokota AB's airlifters have used the permanently painted hard surface on the main runway.

The taxiway was brought out of retirement and repurposed for this exercise as a landing zone, or LZ, which is an area designated to land in lieu of a runway. Oftentimes, C-130s use LZs down-range to resupply front-line troops who may be in an area where a runway is not available or accessible.

This training is conducted to guarantee the airfield team is ready to perform skilled landings on short, narrow, crowded and even unmarked strips of land.

Aircraft do not land on a temporarily established runway by themselves and, because of this, the training is not just for the C-130J aircrew, but it is also for the entire team running operations on the flightline.

"It was really a group effort to make

this exercise a success and it was great to see us all work so well together," said 1st Lt. Aaron Church, 374th Operations Support Squadron airfield operations officer.

The 374th OSS Airfield Operations Flight encompasses air traffic controllers, airfield management Airmen, and radar and airfield weather systems technicians, who perform different essential skill-sets, but work as one to operate the airfield and airspace at Yokota AB.

"Measuring out and marking a LZ would normally be an airfield management task; and clearing a C-130 to land would be an ATC task," Church said. "Here at Yokota (AB), the 374th OSS is training all three essential skill sets to be able to do either task, if required."

The shift in training methodology is in support of Pacific Air Forces' Agile Combat Employment concept.

"PACAF has given us a basic concept of operations and a goal to make ACE a reality," Church said. "We are developing how to train, equip our Airmen and operate from the ground up."

The airfield operations flight is pioneering what it looks like to train for ACE by cross-training their career fields and enabling C-130J aircrews to be assault landing-capable.

## DOD releases overseas stop movement order

WASHINGTON — On March 25, Secretary of Defense Mark Esper enacted a 60-day stop movement order for all Department of Defense uniformed and civilian personnel and their sponsored family members overseas.

This measure is taken to aid in further prevention of the

spread of coronavirus, to protect U.S. personnel and preserve the operational readiness of our global force.

Building upon previously enacted movement restrictions governing foreign travel, permanent change of station moves, temporary duty and personal leave, this stop movement order will also impact exercises,

ARLINGTON, Va. — As Covid-19 health protection conditions and physical distancing guidelines inhibit access to barber shops, hair salons and fitness centers across the Air Force, leadership released guidance allowing installation commanders to make deviations to grooming and fitness standards.

In a message to Airmen March 31, Lt. Gen. Brian T. Kelly, Air Force deputy chief of staff for manpower, personnel and services, explained installation commanders have the authority to adjust standards as needed, while also encouraging Airmen to maintain grooming and fitness standards to the greatest extent possible.

## Deviations acceptable due to access to hair care, fitness facilities

“Our professionalism and pride comes through in many ways, but starts with us being mentally and physically disciplined to look the part,” he said. “In uncertain times, it is even more important that our Airmen and Space professionals are able to provide a sense of stability and professionalism. We count on commanders to find the appropriate balance and maintain our place within the profession of arms as we carry out our duty to the American public.”

To ensure the health and safety of service members and their families, commanders have the authority to allow

deviations to both grooming and fitness standards. Adjustments should be done within reason and not inhibit proper uniform wear, accomplishment of duties, impact individual readiness or prevent the use of protective or safety equipment.

“While adjustments for (fitness) testing were necessary under our current circumstances, service members are still expected to maintain personal fitness to ensure continued good health and readiness,” Kelly said. “In the rare circumstance where individuals who are not otherwise under a medical

profile are unable to maintain fitness standards due to safety or other restrictions, commanders have authority to deviate from fitness standards to ensure the health and safety of service members and families.”

Airmen are expected to adhere to shaving standards outlined in Air Force Instruction 36-2903, Dress and Personal Appearance.

## Commissaries installing Plexiglass at checkouts

FORT LEE, Va. – Military commissaries worldwide are installing plexiglass sneeze shields in all regular checkout lanes to add extra protection for customers and cashiers during the Covid-19 outbreak.

Plexiglass shields are currently being installed and will be in all commissaries in the next several days. The plexiglass panels are 36 inches high and range in width from 24-30 inches. They will not be placed at self-checkout stands.

The panels are just one of many protective measures the Defense Commissary Agency is implementing to follow the highest standards of the Department of Defense's health protection in our stores, said retired Rear Adm. Robert J. Bianchi, DOD special

assistant for commissary operations.

“We at the Defense Commissary Agency want to reassure our valued customers and our dedicated employees that their health and welfare are our No. 1 concern,” Bianchi said. “At our commissaries we are wiping down checkout areas, restrooms and shopping carts with disinfectant, and practicing routine hand washing and other basic sanitation measures to avoid spreading germs.”

“We’re also encouraging our employees to closely monitor their health and well-being, and asking them to stay home if they, or someone in their household, are sick.”

Preparing for and responding to emergencies is nothing new for DeCA, the admiral added.

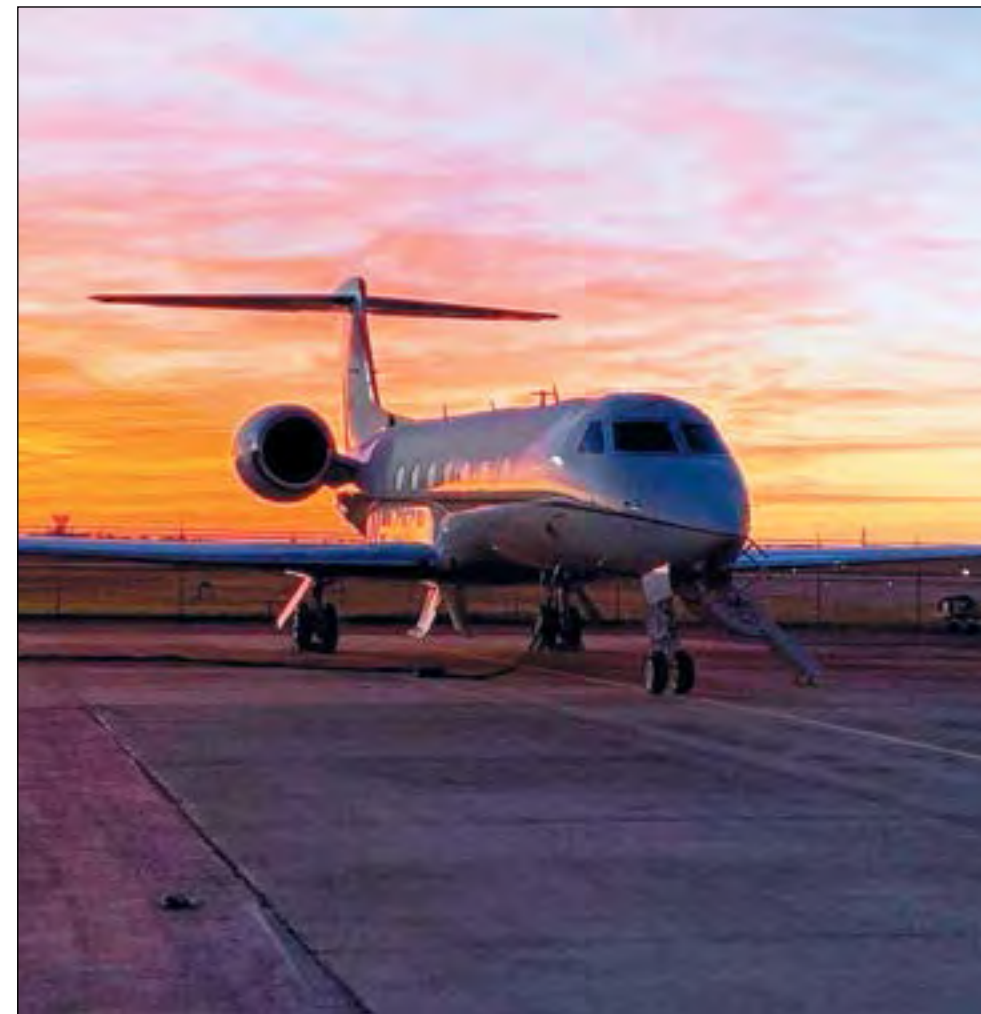

# C-37B arrives early

WRIGHT-PATTERSON AIR FORCE BASE, Ohio — The Air Force Life Cycle Management Center delivered the latest C-37B special air mission aircraft to the 89th Airlift Wing at Joint Base Andrews, Maryland, March 25.

The program, managed by the Presidential and Executive Airlift Division, delivered the aircraft one week ahead of schedule.

“I’m proud our team is showing the Air Force stands ready to meet our mission,” said Brig. Gen.

Ryan Britton, Air Force program executive officer for Presidential and Executive Airlift. “We are taking care of our people, doing all we can to flatten the Covid-19 curve while maintaining our mission-focus on delivering capability to the warfighter.”

The program will deliver two additional C-37Bs by the end of fiscal year '21 which will bring the fleet to 16 aircraft. The next delivery is expected in the third quarter of 2021.

The 89th Airlift Wing provides global special air mission airlift, logistics, aerial port and communications for the president,

vice president, cabinet members, combatant commanders and other senior military and elected leaders as tasked by the White House, Air Force chief of staff and Air Mobility Command.

The C-37B is a twin-engine, turbofan aircraft acquired to fill the worldwide special air missions for high-ranking government and Defense Department officials. The C-37B is based upon the high-altitude, intercontinental Gulfstream 550 aircraft. With a crew of five, the aircraft can carry 12 passengers, with a range of 6750 nautical miles.

# CDC delivers host of tips to cope with impact of coronavirus

## Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

The outbreak of coronavirus disease 2019 may be stressful for people.

Fear and anxiety about a disease can be overwhelming and cause strong emotions in adults and children. Coping with stress will make you, the people you care about, and your community stronger.

Everyone reacts differently to stressful situations. How you respond to the outbreak can depend on your background, the things that make you different from other people, and the community you live in.

People who may respond more strongly to the stress of a crisis include:

- Older people and people with chronic diseases who are at higher risk for Covid-19.
- Children and teens.
- People who are helping with the response to Covid-19, like doctors and other health care providers, or first responders.
- People who have mental health conditions including problems with substance use.

Stress during an infectious disease outbreak can include

- Fear and worry about your own health and the health of your loved ones.
- Changes in sleep or eating patterns.
- Difficulty sleeping or concentrating.
- Worsening of chronic health problems.
- Increased use of alcohol, tobacco or other drugs.

### Things you can do to support yourself

- Take breaks from watching, reading or listening to news stories, including social media. Hearing about the pandemic repeatedly can be upsetting.
- Take care of your body. Take deep breaths, stretch, or meditateexternal icon. Try to eat healthy, well-balanced meals, exercise regularly, get plenty of sleep, and avoid alcohol and drugsexternal icon.
- Make time to unwind. Try to do some other activities you enjoy.
- Connect with others. Talk with people you trust about your concerns and how you are feeling.

Call your health care provider if stress gets in the way of your daily activities for several days in a row.

### Reduce stress in yourself and others

Sharing the facts about Covid-19 and understanding the actual risk to yourself and people you care about can make an outbreak less stressful.

### For parents

Children and teens react, in part, on what they see from the adults around them. When parents and caregivers deal with

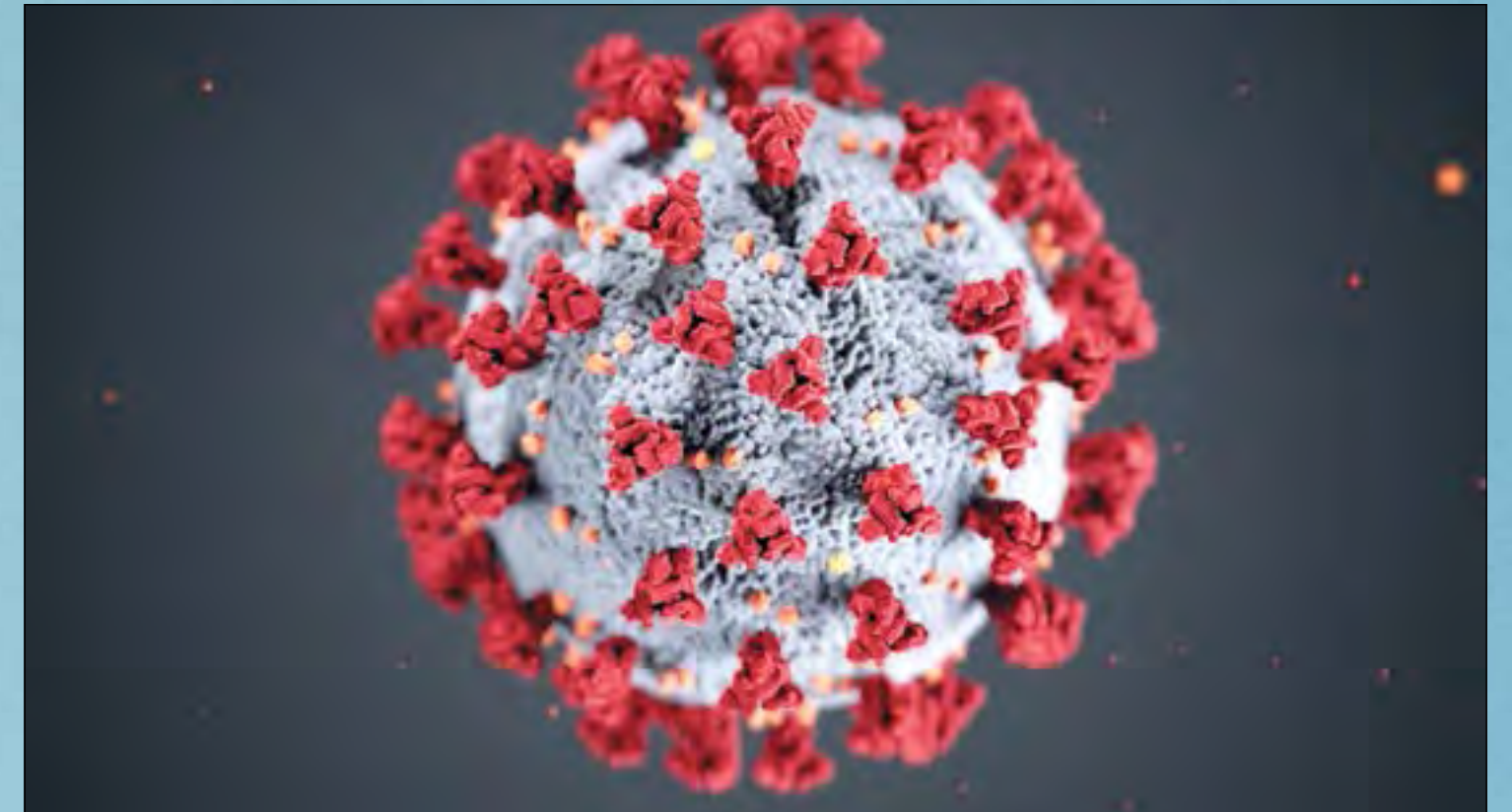
the Covid-19 calmly and confidently, they can provide the best support for their children. Parents can be more reassuring to others around them, especially children, if they are better prepared.

Not all children and teens respond to stress in the same way. Some common changes to watch for include:

- Excessive crying or irritation in younger children.
- Returning to behaviors they have outgrown (for example, toileting accidents or bed-wetting).
- Excessive worry or sadness.
- Unhealthy eating or sleeping habits.
- Irritability and “acting out” behaviors in teens.
- Poor school performance or avoiding school.
- Difficulty with attention and concentration.
- Avoidance of activities enjoyed in the past.
- Unexplained headaches or body pain.
- Use of alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs.

### There are many things you can do to support your child

- Take time to talk with your child or teen about the Covid-19 outbreak. Answer questions and share facts about Covid-19 in a way that your child or teen can understand.
- Reassure your child or teen that they are safe. Let them know it is ok if they feel upset. Share with them how you deal with your own stress so that they can learn how to cope from you.
- Limit your family’s exposure to news coverage of the event, including social media.

- Try to keep up with regular routines. If schools are closed, create a schedule for learning activities and relaxing or fun activities.

### For responders

Responding to Covid-19 can take an emotional toll on you. There are things you can do to reduce secondary traumatic stress reactions:

- Allow time for you and your family to recover from responding to the pandemic.

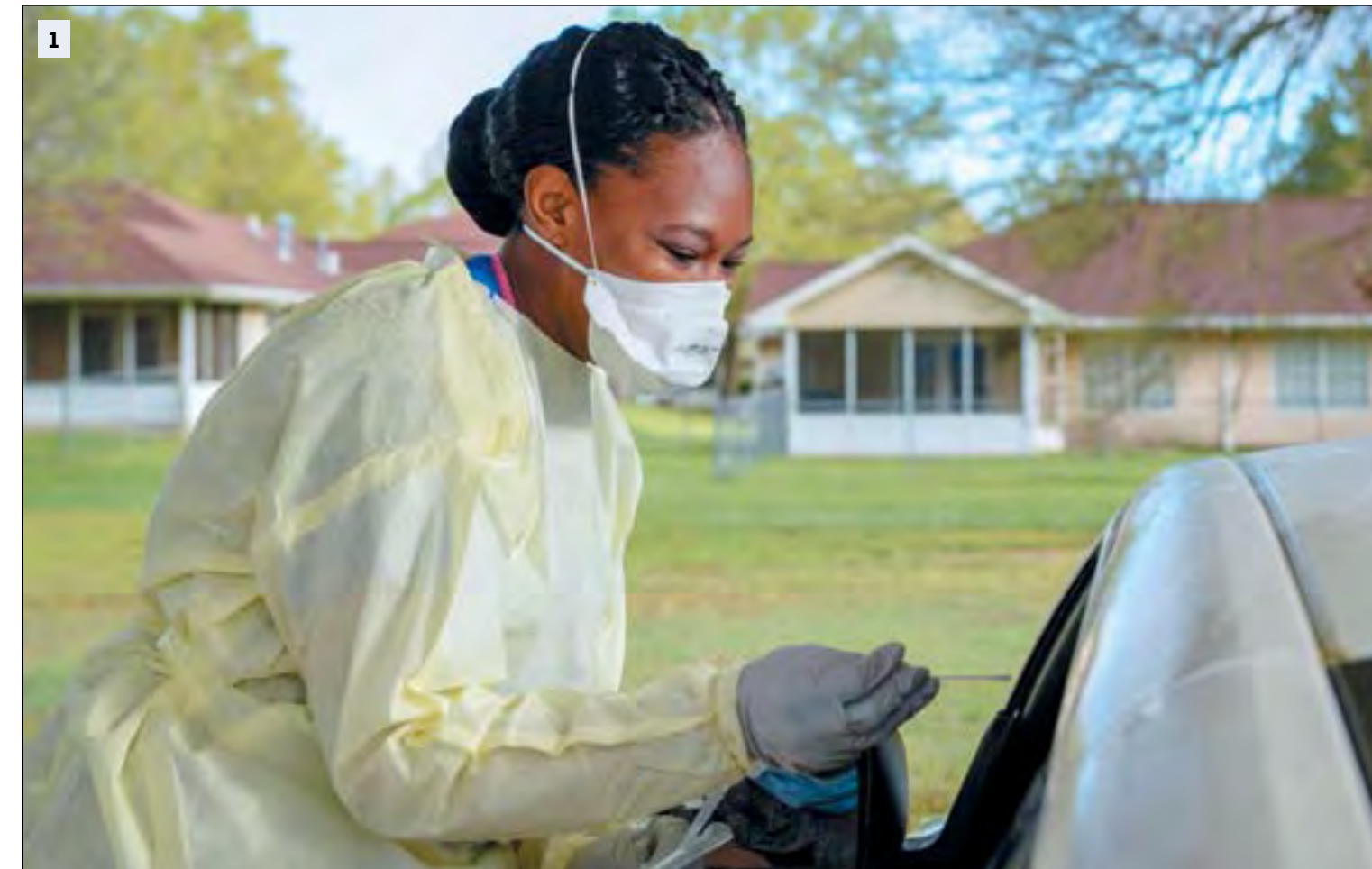

deployments, redeployments and other global force management activities. Approximately 90,000 service members slated to deploy or redeploy over the next 60 days will likely be impacted by this stop movement order.

Embedded within the order are mechanisms by which exceptions can be granted. Authorized exceptions to the order include:

- Travel by patients and medical providers for the purposes of medical treatment for DOD personnel and their families.
- Scheduled deployments / redeployments of U.S. Navy

vessels and embarked units, provided they are in transit for 14 days and have met the restriction of movement (ROM) requirements associated with current force health protection guidance.

- Individuals who have already initiated travel.
- Individuals whose TDY ends while this order is in effect are authorized to return to their home station.

Additional exceptions may be granted on a case-by-case scenario in which travel is deemed mission essential, humanitarian in nature or warranted due to extreme hardship. Such exceptions may be approved by Combatant Commanders, the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, or Secretaries of Military Departments.

train with in standard day-to-day training," said Maj. Daniel House, 35th Operations Support Squadron assistant director of operations. "We have offensive and defensive teams, each with their own objectives and mission sets. This exercise gives our aviators the opportunity to really stretch their legs."

This exercise's iteration included F-16 Fighting Falcons from the 13th and 14th Fighter Squadrons, command and control assets assigned to the 610th Air Control Flight, and surface-to-air missile simulators from the Japanese Ground Self Defense Force 101st Antiaircraft Artillery Unit from Camp Hachinohe. Each of these units play a critical role in the

mutual defense of Japan, and by joining forces for an exercise of this scale, enables all personnel involved the opportunity to interact as they would in a real-world scenario.

"The (Pacific Weasel) exercises are a great time for us to fully mission plan, execute and debrief a mission set that is essential to Misawa and our host nation partners," said Capt. Peter Magness, 13th Fighter Squadron electronic combat pilot. "We had the opportunity to train with SAM site operators. Misawa (AB) is fortunate to have a series of emitters at Draughton Range that we get to train with, but the incorporation of the JGSDF into (Pacific Weasel) gives us an extra layer of realistic training for our Wild Weasel mission. With Red Flag-Alaska 20-01 being canceled because of Covid-19 travel restrictions, days like this

still allow us to participate in large force exercises and develop good learning points."

Given that the 35th Fighter Wing hosts the only units in the Indo-Pacific region whose mission is the suppression of enemy air defenses –otherwise known as the Wild Weasel mission–the ability to partner with its JGSDF counterparts is critical to pilot development and training. House said Pacific Weasel's future is limitless.

"Currently, Draughton Range is one of the most dynamic and unique ranges we have outside of the United States. We have capabilities here that you can't get anywhere else. In the future, we would love to see (Pacific Weasel) fill the gap between day-to-day training and large force exercise like Cope North, or any of the Red Flags, and I think we are well on the way to doing that here."

military readiness.

"There are certain services we must continue to provide such as cancer treatments, the pharmacy, laboratory, hemodialysis and radiology; all of those services are still available," she said. "Our emergency department is open; we are still providing urgent care; and all of our inpatient wards are open. We are also coordinating surgeries with patients on a case-by-case basis."

The medical group also established two Covid-19 clinics, one consisting of a series of tents outside the DGMC emergency room and another inside the facility.

"The tents outside the emergency room were constructed the weekend before March 16 in concert with the Covid-19 clinic inside DGMC, and within 48 hours we were receiving patients," said Capt. Tyler Padgett, 60th MDG Family Health Clinic physician and one of the physicians working in the Travis Covid-19 clinics.

"Our mission is to ensure people are safe and healthy at

this base," said Padgett. "We are creating and implementing plans to keep our Airmen and families safe, whether they're required to be isolated or quarantined, and we are doing all we can to prevent the spread of Covid-19 while ensuring we can execute our mission."

One way the medical group is doing that is through screening locations set up across the base including the passenger terminal, satellite pharmacy and child development centers. Hand sanitizer is also now readily available at the entrances of the Base Exchange and commissary.

Implementing telehealth options has also enabled doctors to discuss concerns with patients without placing additional risk on providers and patients alike, Padgett added.

"The family health clinic where I work is now mainly seeing patients virtually, but still ensuring our Airmen are mission-ready by completing a variety of requirements, including preventative health assessments," Padgett said.

Preventative health assessments are required periodically for military members to ensure they are fit for duty. Much of

the responsibility for completing those assessments falls on DGMC's Flight Medicine Clinic, which is now, temporarily, located in the dental clinic since the internal Covid-19 clinic now occupies the space the flight medicine clinic once called home.

Over a five-day period from March 16-20, the Flight Medicine Clinic completed 93 PHAs, 31 annual flight PHAs and processed 20 medical clearances.

"This is a challenging time as we work to maintain readiness while mitigating the risk of spreading Covid-19," said Maj. Alisha Florence, 60th Aerospace Medicine Squadron flight and operational medicine commander. "We have to project a powerful and ready Air Force not just to our country, but to our enemies as well."

number of trainees in each bay decreased from roughly 60 to 40 trainees. Additionally, classroom and indoor training has been adjusted to allow more space between trainees and trainees are only sitting two per table in the dining facility as opposed to the typical four. Finally, trainees are maintaining appropriate spacing while waiting to receive meals. Overall sanitation has been implemented across the BMT campus to ensure necessary cleaning practices for day-to-day operations.

Additionally, mission-essential instructors and support staff have been offered the option to stay on base to help provide added protection to their families at no personal cost.

"The safety and well-being of our permanent party personnel is equally as important as that of

our trainees," Blazier said. "We recognize the significant stress this puts on our team, and we are completely committed to ensuring our people feel safe to the fullest extent possible while we deal with this threat."

In addition, an enhanced

medical screening and response capability has been put in place to ensure immediate treatment for Covid-19 is available to trainees through the efforts of the 59th Medical Wing and Brooke Army Medical Center.

In the event a trainee

experiences any of the published Covid-19 symptoms, the member is immediately transferred to a medical facility, examined, tested and placed into quarantine as a "person under investigation" until cleared. The member will receive treatment and will remain isolated until test results are returned.

If testing is negative, the trainee is returned to training. Should a trainee test positive for Covid-19, the trainee will continue to receive necessary medical attention and go into isolation status.

As a precaution following a trainee's positive test, the trainees in close contact with the individual who tested positive will restart their 14-day ROM period.

Within the military training staff, BMT continues to actively review all personnel that have been impacted by Covid-19 events. All personnel are directed to strictly adhere to medical guidance and CDC directives

while being monitored for any Covid-19 symptoms.

"U.S. Air Force senior leaders have deemed BMT, technical training and flying training as mission essential because it creates the world's greatest Airmen," Blazier said. "These are unprecedented times, with the situation evolving rapidly, but the great men and women of the Gateway Wing will continue to hold strong. We won't make exceptions to keep them safe and leaders at every level will continually validate the protection, health and safety of our Air Force team."
